Dr. Frese is a psychologist with forty years experience working with persons with serious mental illness. Since retiring from the Ohio mental health system where he served as Director of Psychology at Western Reserve Psychiatric Hospital for 15 years, he has coordinated the Summit County Recovery Project, serving consumers in the Akron area. He is an associate professor of psychology in clinical psychiatry at the Northeast Ohio Universities College of Medicine and Case Western Reserve University, and on National Institute for the Severely Handicapped (NISH), and the Treatment Advocacy Center (TAC). He was also the longest serving member of Board of Trustees of National Alliance on Mentally Illness (NAMI).
