Resource Materials for Bidders  
Regarding  
“High Complex/Intensity” Children**

**Definition:**

Children with complex or intense needs require more intensive supports (including both direct supports and clinical involvement), more frequent contact/team meetings, and potentially the involvement of more individuals due to their behavioral health presentation and current life situation.

**Identification Process:**

Children with complex or intense behavioral health needs are identified as follows, based on the following demographic data set (CIS) fields:

- 1) Field 11 Referral Source
  - a) 36 CPS-24 Hour Urgent Response
  - b) 38 Arizona Department of Economic Security
  - c) 40 Criminal justice/correctional (includes AOC-Probation, ADOC, ADJC, Jail)
- 2) Field 33 ADC Parole (for 18-21 yo only)
  - a) Enters Yes
- 3) Field 34 ADJC Parole
  - a) Enters Yes
- 4) Field 35 ADHS CRS
  - a) Enters Yes
- 5) Field 36 Adult Probation (for 18-21 yo only)
  - a) Enters Yes
- 6) Field 37 AOC Juvenile Probation
  - a) Enters Yes
- 7) Field 38 DES CPS
  - a) Enters Yes
- 8) Field 39 DES DDD
  - a) Enters Yes
- 9) Field 51a Priority SMI (for 18-21 yo only in Maricopa County)
  - a) Enters Yes
- 10) Field 69 Primary Residence
  - a) 05 Arizona State Hospital
  - b) 06 Jail/prison/detention
  - c) 07 homeless/homeless shelter
  - d) 09 Foster home or Therapeutic Foster Home
  - e) 19 Crisis shelter
  - f) 22 Level I, II, or III behavioral health treatment setting
- 11) Field 70 Axis V
  - a) 0-40 on the Children’s Global Assessment Scale
  - b) 0-40 on the Global Assessment of Functioning for 18-21 yo only
