For the Training on the Involuntary Commitment Process for Tribal Communities

Training Sites and Dates

The training will feature presentations on the unique state and tribal legal, jurisdictional and behavioral health issues that arise from efforts to use the Involuntary Commitment process for tribal members residing on Indian Reservations. Problem resolution discussions on these issues will also be held and documented.

Topics will include:

- Tribal jurisdiction over tribal members,
- “Domestication” of tribal court orders by state courts,
- AzSH requirements and process for admission,
- Funding of behavioral health services for American Indians; and
- Continuity of care issues prior to admission and after discharge
