THE ARIZONA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES has found, under the authority of A.R.S. § 36-2232 et seq and Pursuant to Department of Health Services rules, that public necessity requires the operation of

FRY FIRE DISTRICT

as a ground ALS and BLS ambulance service in the State of Arizona for the transportation of individuals who are sick, injured, wounded or otherwise incapacitated or helpless within the following service area, with the following central operations station and response times:

1. Service Area:

The Fry Fire District: The area bounded on the North by Milepost 300 on Highway 90; on the West by Santa Cruz County Line; on the South by the Mexican Border; and on the East by the San Pedro River. Fry Fire District will provide immediate response (911) transports within the certificated service area of the Sierra Vista Fire Department, CON No. 24 (excluding Fort Huachuca).

2. Central Operating Station: Sierra Vista, Arizona (4817 Apache Street).

3. Sub-Operating Station: None.

4. Response Times:

a. URBAN RESPONSE AREA:

Response to 90% of all calls within the defined Urban Response Area will be within 12 minutes.

The Urban Response Area is defined as:

Township 21 South, Range 20 East, further described as the Southeast quarter of Section 34 (The Fry Township), and the South half of Section 25 (Rancho Carmela), Sections 15, 21,22, 29, 30 and the South half of Section 20.

Now, therefore, by virtue of the authority vested in the Arizona Department of Health Services, under the constitution and laws of the State of Arizona, does hereby grant this

CERTIFICATE OF NECESSITY

authorizing the operation of the aforesaid ambulance service for a period ending OCTOBER 31, 2018 unless for cause sooner amended, suspended, revoked or terminated subject to the decisions and orders, and rules of the Department.

PROVIDED, that this certificate shall not be assigned nor transferred unless authorized by the Arizona Department of Health Services.

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URBAN RESPONSE AREA (cont)

Township 22 South, Range 20 East, further described as the Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 1. The South half of the Southwest quarter of Section 1; the North 2 of Section 12; the South 2 of the Northwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 3 (Sulger): Township 23 South, Range 20 East, further described as Sections 1,2,3, 9, 10, 11, 12, 24, 25, 26, 35 and 36, excluding Fort Huachuca.

Township 22 South, Range 21 East, further described as the Northwest quarter of Section 4, Northwest quarter of Section 5, and Sections 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35 and 36. Township 23 South, Range 21, East, further described as Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 17, 18, 19 and 20. Township 23 South, Range 22 East, Sections 6 and 7.

b. RURAL RESPONSE AREA:

Response to 95% of all calls within the defined Rural Response Area will be within 45 minutes. The Rural Response Area is defined as:

The area North of the City of Sierra Vista to Milepost 300 on Highway 9, except Fort Huachuca and South of the Southerly boundary of the Fry Fire District to the Mexican border, to include Huachuca City, Whetstone, Presidential Estates, Hereford and Palominas areas, and East to the San Pedro River (Note: Response from Station 3, located at 4817 Apache Street, North to Milepost 300 on State Route 90 took 30 minutes. Travel distance is 30 miles. Response from Station 4, in the Moson Road area will take longer, up to 45 minutes).

c. WILDERNESS AREAS:

Response to 100% of all calls within the defined Wilderness Response Area will be within 60 minutes.

The Wilderness Response Area is defined as:

The areas West of the Fry Fire District, not including Ft. Huachuca and government-owned lands, to the Western border of Cochise County to include Parker Canyon Lake. Areas South and West of State Route 92, outside the areas designated as rural, are included in the wilderness definition.
