



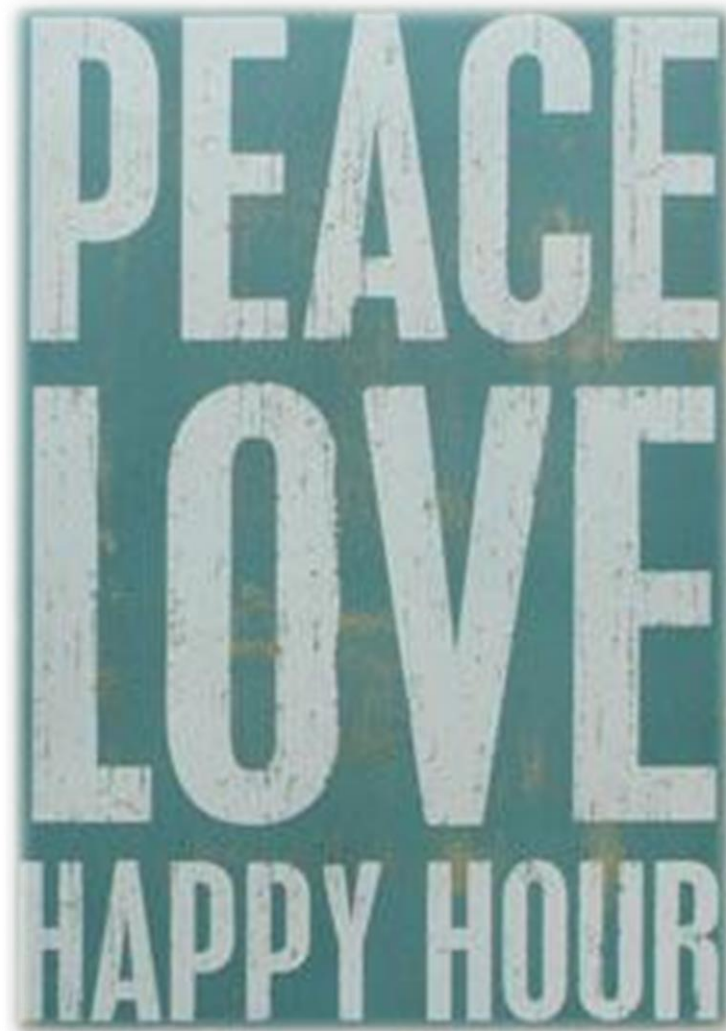

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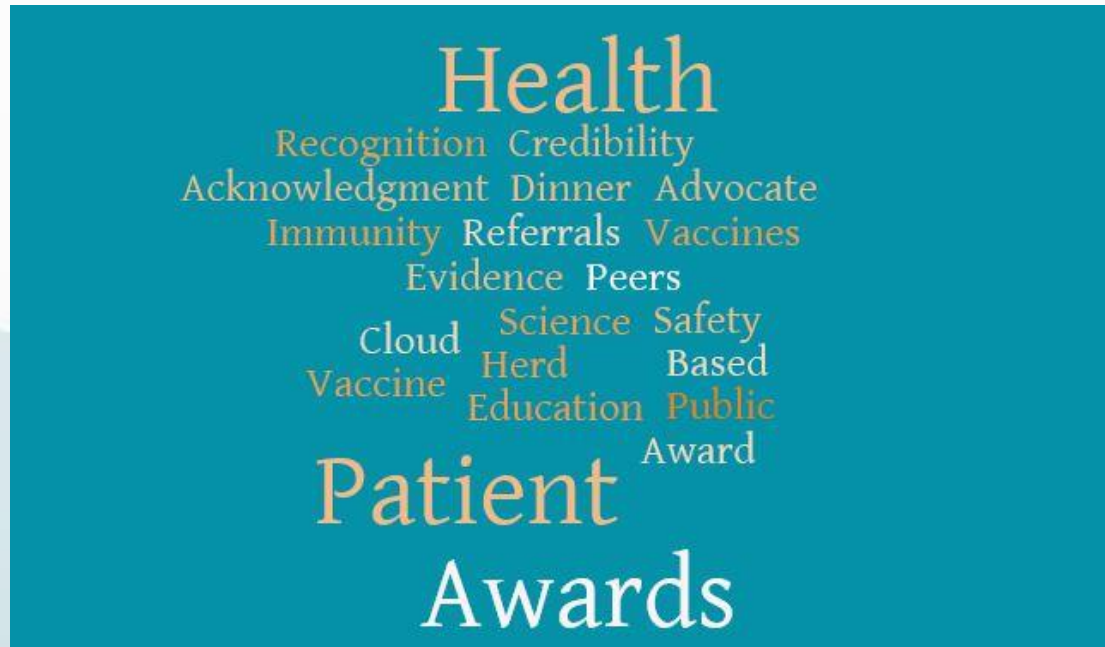

DR. DANIEL T. CLOUD OUTSTANDING PRACTICE AWARDS

The **ARIZONA PARTNERSHIP FOR IMMUNIZATION (TAPI)** is seeking nominations for the 2015 Toddler and Teen awards. These awards recognize the exceptional efforts of the many individuals and organizations whose tireless work and innovative strategies have improved immunization coverage levels statewide. We look forward to our annual awards banquet as an opportunity to publicly recognize immunization efforts over the past year.

The **TODDLER AWARD** is presented to those practices and clinics that have achieved the highest standard in their practice by reaching a 90% coverage level for 4 DTaP, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 3 Hib, 3 Hep B and 1 Varicella for two year olds. A minimum of 25 active patients is required. Upon nomination, *ADHS will use ASIIS data to validate coverage levels.*

The **TEEN AWARD** is presented to those practices and clinics that have achieved the highest standard in their practice by reaching a 90% coverage level for 1 Tdap, 1 MCV and 2 HPV vaccinations for 15 year olds. A minimum of 20 active patients is required. Upon nomination, *ADHS will use ASIIS data to validate coverage levels.*

Each Cloud Award recognizes the recipient for 2 full years. Practices may apply for one award each year.

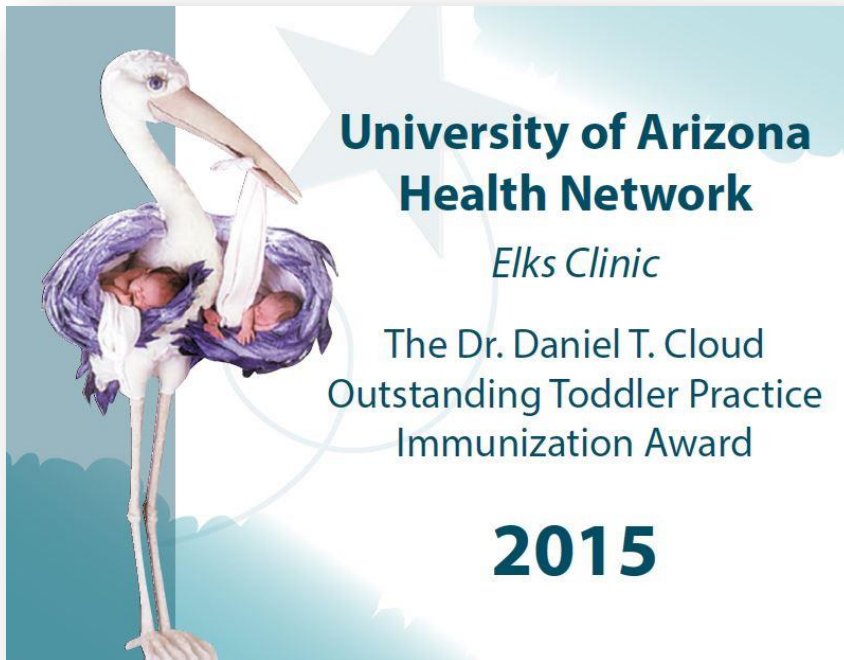



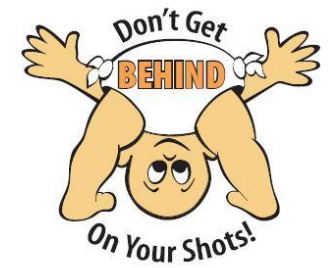

ASIS Grows With Your Kids
From Newborn to Toddler to School-Aged Kids

What is ASIS?
An electronic record system, like a baby book that tracks your child's immunizations. Web-based system that doctors and clinics update each time kids are immunized. Data base that has stored immunization records since 1996.

Why ASIS Benefits You
Your child's doctor or clinic can print immunization history for you. ASIS records are useful for: child care, school and summer programs. ASIS shows you what vaccines your child needs.

How Parents Can Help
Ask the doctor or clinic to keep your child's ASIS record up to date. Request your child's ASIS record at the next healthcare visit. Ask the doctor or clinic to report missing doses to ASIS at 1-877-481-5741.

Vaccines are the simplest way to keep you & your family healthy & well!

Doctors, scientists and pharmacists work together to make vaccines against the most harmful diseases so they can protect their families and yours.

If we all get vaccines, we prevent the germs from spreading in our community. This is called **Herd Immunity** and protects our family members and neighbors who can't get vaccines.

Measles Information

Signs and Symptoms

What Are Symptoms of Measles?

1. Fever - as high as 103-105 degrees
2. Cough
3. Runny nose (Coryza)
4. Red, watery eyes (Conjunctivitis)
5. Rash

What Does the Rash Look Like?

A red, blotchy rash which begins 2-4 days after other symptoms have started. The rash typically starts first on the face and upper body.

Think You Have the Measles?

CALL YOUR HEALTH CARE PROVIDER FIRST.
MEASLES IS HIGHLY CONTAGIOUS.
CALLING AHEAD FOR INSTRUCTIONS WILL HELP AVOID EXPOSING OTHERS.

9 of 10 unvaccinated people exposed to measles will become infected.

Get your kids vaccinated. The first dose of MMR1 is given on or after their 1st birthday. The second dose of MMR1 should be given at age 4-6 years. However it may be given as soon as 1 month after the first dose.



Adults who do not know if they are protected against the measles should call and talk to their doctor.

Vaccinating yourself not only protects you and your family, it also protects those too young to get the vaccine (Infants) and those that are not able to get the MMR vaccine.

What is Pertussis?


- ◆ Pertussis is a serious disease. Symptoms can include a runny nose, mild fever and a cough. The cough then turns into severe coughing fits and can last six or more weeks.
- ◆ Did you know that pertussis is especially dangerous in newborns because they are too young to receive the pertussis vaccine?
- ◆ The disease causes infants to cough so much that some have trouble breathing, leading to hospitalization and potentially death.

Not Just Kids are at Risk

- ◆ Pertussis easily spreads from person to person, family member to family member.
- ◆ Family members can unknowingly spread pertussis to the most vulnerable, your own babies.
- ◆ Anyone that has not been vaccinated against pertussis (Tdap vaccine) is at a higher risk of getting pertussis and passing it on to an infant or child.

Protect your Family

- ◆ Vaccinate family members with a Tdap vaccine to protect against pertussis.
- ◆ Don't forget that this includes your teens, grandparents and close family friends.
- ◆ Talk to your doctor or call your health plan for Tdap vaccine information.

Is Your Child Protected?

ABC Facts About Childhood Shots:

Does my child really need baby shots?

- Yes! Childhood Shots help a child's immune system to do its work.
- If your child is not immunized they are not protected...neither in the community.
- Talk to your health care provider to find out what shots your child needs. If they are behind, ask about a catch-up schedule.
- Remember, teens need shots too! Visit WhyImmunize.org for more information.

Are baby shots safe for my child?

- Yes, although your child might experience a temporary, mild fever or soreness where the shot was given, serious reactions to baby shots are rare.
- Scientific studies have found no relationship between vaccines and autism.
- Thimerosal was removed from baby shots in 2000.
- Visit WhyImmunize.org/Vaccine-Safety for more information.

What if my child is sick?

- Talk to your health care provider. It is still okay for your child to get shots if he or she has a mild fever, a cold or diarrhea. The shots will not make your child sicker but will protect him or her against vaccine preventable diseases.

How do I keep track of my child's baby shots?

- All children are required to show a complete baby shot record before entering school or child care.
- All immunizations should be recorded in a Lifetime Immunization Record.
- Ask your health care provider to keep your child's ASIS record up to date.
- Take your child's immunization record to every doctor visit.

C Classes
Enroll all family members in swimming lessons. Learn CPR as a family.

Emergency Warning Signs

Seek medical care immediately if you experience these symptoms:

Concerns in Children	Concerns in Adults
Fast breathing or trouble breathing	Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
Not drinking enough fluids	Not drinking enough fluids
Severe or persistent vomiting	Severe or persistent vomiting
Flu-like symptoms improve but then return with fever or worse cough	Flu-like symptoms improve but then return with fever or worse cough
Not waking up or interacting	Confusion
Irritability and not wanting to be held	Sudden dizziness
Bluish or gray skin color	Pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen

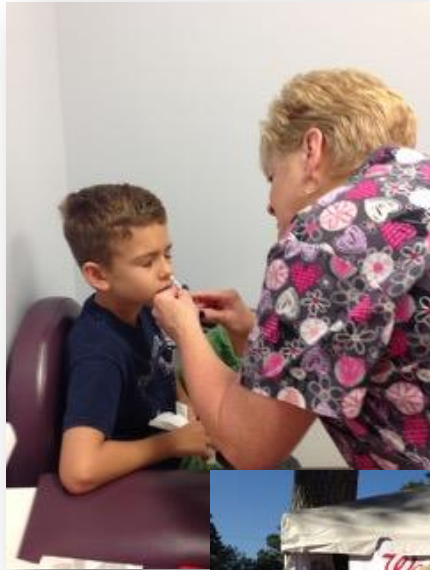
