


Arizona's Colorectal Cancer Roundtable, April 11, 2016

Post-Meeting Evaluation Results (N = 40)


The evaluation survey had an 80% response rate.

1. After attending the roundtable, how much knowledge do you now have about:


a) *The National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable's 80% by 2018 initiative (n = 40)?*




b) *Barriers to colorectal cancer screening in Arizona (n = 40)?*
