Background

In November 1994, Arizona voters approved the Tobacco Tax and Health Care Initiative. This initiative imposed additional state taxes on tobacco products for the purpose of generating revenue for various health programs.

During the spring of 1995, the Arizona Legislature passed enabling legislation, House Bill 2275, that allocated funding for the provision of primary care and other services.

Two components of the Tobacco Tax Primary Care Program were funded: "Primary Care Development and Initial Operations" (Part A) and "Primary Care Services" (Part B). The Program provided for the development and enhancement of a statewide capacity for cost-effective, comprehensive, community-based primary care services for low income, uninsured Arizonans of all ages.

During the spring of 2003, the Arizona Legislature reallocated the Tobacco Tax funding. As a result, the ADHS Primary Care Program has received a direct appropriation from the General Fund to continue services initiated in 1995. A single request for proposal was released by the Arizona Department of Health Services to create new contracts effective July 1, 2005.

Total funding for FY 2007 is \$13 million dollars. These funds were awarded to nineteen contractors, all of whom provide comprehensive primary care services at 143 sites statewide.

Primary Care Program Purpose

The purpose of the ADHS Primary Care Program (PCP) is to develop and maintain an enhanced statewide capacity for delivery of comprehensive, community-based primary (health) care services to low-income, uninsured residents of Arizona.

Eligibility

Persons of all age group who:

- Have a family income at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Guidelines.
- Are uninsured
- Are not eligible for AHCCCS, KidsCare, and/or Medicare
- Are residents of Arizona

Discounted Fee Services (Sliding Fee Scale) are based upon the 2007 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines. This guideline is updated every year. Persons may qualify as follows:
