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Debilitating Medical Condition Decision Form

January 15, 2014

Pursuant to A.R.S. §36-2801.01 entitled, "Addition of debilitating medical conditions" (Caution: 1998 Prop. 105 applies), "The public may petition the department to add debilitating medical conditions or treatments to the list of debilitating medical conditions set forth in section 36-2801, paragraph 3. The department shall consider petitions in the manner required by department rule, including public notice and hearing. The department shall approve or deny a petition within one-hundred-eighty days of its submission. The approval or denial of a petition is a final decision of the department subject to judicial review pursuant to title 12, chapter 7, article 6. Jurisdiction and venue are vested in the superior court."

The Arizona Department of Health Services Director, after having the Medical Advisory Committee review the evidence provided through written submission, and consideration of oral testimony at public hearing, has determined the following:

Debilitating Medical Condition(s) or Treatment(s) considered:	Determination
Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)	Will not be added
Migraines	Will not be added
Depression	Will not be added

Debilitating medical conditions that may not have been approved for addition may be considered during future petition reviews if a petition is received by the Arizona Department of Health Services within the scheduled acceptance periods.
