Online Naloxone Administration for EMT and Law Enforcement Training

Through the **First Responders-Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (FR-CARA)** cooperative agreement, faculty members at the University of Arizona created an online training module to instruct EMTs and Law Enforcement Officers on the recognition of opioid overdose and naloxone use. The module is free, can be completed asynchronously, online, and at the learner's desired pace.

It includes information and training regarding the state of the current opioid epidemic, recognizing opioid use and overdose, identifying conditions which may mimic opioid overdose, recommended treatment (naloxone administration), and additional resources for patients with opioid use disorder. Following completion of the online training, EMTs and Law Enforcement Officers will be prepared to recognize opioid overdose and administer life-saving treatment(s) including naloxone in its approved forms as well as CPR or respiratory support if indicated.

The information contained in this module has previously been reviewed and approved by the ADHS for use in in-person presentation and training and has been adapted to an online module.
